

Morning Bible Study

I keep praying that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, will give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation in knowing Christ fully. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you may know the hope to which he has called you, just how rich his glorious inheritance among the saints is, and just how surpassingly great his *power is for us who believe. (Ephesians 1:17-19)*

The Apostle Paul was praying for his people. He wanted them to know and understand God's blessings given to them in Christ Jesus.

Of course, the Christians in Ephesus understood the basic truths of the Christian faith. They knew about the transforming power of God's gospel message. They had seen firsthand how the Holy Spirit brought them to faith through God's Word. But no matter how "advanced" these Christians may have been in the truths of the faith, the Apostle wanted them to ponder again and again their forgiveness through Christ crucified and risen. He wanted them to continue to "[know] Christ fully." Why?

Because Christians still need to hear God's promises. The Ephesian Christians faced the same temptations that you face on a daily basis. Satan was working hard against their hearts and minds with his lies and half-truths, as he does against you. Without the Holy Spirit's continual encouragement through God's Word, they would have undoubtedly forgotten the gospel message and everything it brought them.


The temptations haven't stopped. Satan hasn't stopped working against us. It is tempting to downplay God's promises - especially when we're flooded with trials and worries (whether personally or congregationally). It is tempting to see the gospel as something "less important," setting it aside as we try to fix or solve problems without first commending them to God. When issues and trials confront us, pondering the gospel message can easily become an expendable part of our day, something that is merely assumed and forgotten or drowned out by the busyness of life. This is exactly what our sinful condition desires to do—it desires to forget all about the gospel.

But the gospel—and its blessings—are *so much more* than a fleeting thought. They are so much more than something to be left behind and picked up at our convenience.

Paul understood the Holy Spirit was powerfully working among the Ephesians through God's Word. He passionately wanted them to know and understand how that simple gospel message brought so much to them ... and to all of us at St. Mark as well.

What, exactly, does the gospel bring? The hope you have as a child of God, a steady expectation that during your temporary life here on earth you will continue to have the forgiveness of all sin through Jesus, God's protection and blessings, and more than enough strength to bear burdens and crosses (though they won't be easy to bear!). The gospel brings a glorious inheritance
