

Opening Thought

The Lord went in front of them in a pillar of cloud by day to lead them on their way and in a pillar of fire by night to give them light. In this way they could travel by day and by night. The pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night never left its place in front of the people. (Exodus 13:21-22)

As for you, lift up your staff, stretch out your hand over the sea, and divide the sea so that the Israelites can go through the middle of the sea on dry ground. (Exodus 14:16)

This past week, your children read and heard about the Bible lessons where the LORD miraculously delivered his people, the Israelites from the Egyptians. As the Israelites left Egypt, they had a visible reminder, a tangible way, to see the LORD was with them as he guided them. The words recorded above in Exodus 13 show how the LORD would guide them as a pillar of a cloud during the day and a pillar of fire during the night. What assurance the people must have felt knowing their LORD was with them!

Note also another visible way the LORD demonstrated his presence among the people. Moses used his staff, the staff of God, to do many, many miracles. Just think of the many plagues when Moses used the staff to bring forth the plague. He used the staff to part the waters of the sea. He used the staff to bring forth water from a rock. He used the staff to help the Israelites to defeat the Amalekites by keeping Moses' arms above his head. What a beautiful symbol of God's visible presence of how he fought for his people! Look at Moses' response. Moses built an altar and named it "The Lord Is My Banner," (Exodus 17:15)

As we read the visible ways that showed the LORD's presence, we may often wonder and wish that it would be awfully nice if we could have God's visible assurance that he is with us as well. Wouldn't it be great if that visible presence could encourage us when life got challenging. Surely that would help us to stay focused and help us to never question God's decisions and his wisdom when life gets tough, right?

As New Testament Christians, there is much we need to learn. God is present with us each day. Unlike the Israelites, we have God's visible presence in his written Word. *In the past, God spoke to our forefathers by the prophets at many times and in many ways. In these last days, he has spoken to us by his Son.* (Hebrews 1:1-2a) We have the recorded Old Testament promises of the Savior. We have the New Testament words showing how God kept those promises and seeing the fulfillment of his plan of salvation for sinners. We have the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion where God uses earthly elements connected with his words to offer forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

While the Israelites had the LORD's visible presence, they quickly grumbled and complained when things didn't go well. Are we any different? We compare how difficult our job is compared to our neighbor. We see how blessed others are with their material possessions and loathe in self-pity how we don't enjoy such blessings. We only think about our health when we are sick. How quickly we chase after earthly possessions, and yet find out how hollow those treasures truly are! We are no different than those Israelites in the desert. That is why we need to go to the visible presence of God's Word and confess those sins and seek his forgiveness. Lord have mercy on me a sinner. As God's Law appropriately cuts us down, we find comforting assurance through the tangible presence of his Word. We are assured of his forgiveness. Who is a God like you, who forgives guilt, and who passes over the rebellion of the survivors from his inheritance? He does not hold onto his anger forever. He delights in showing mercy. (Micah 7:18) Thank you God for your presence in our lives. Thank you for your generosity that you shower on us each day. Thank you for your plan of salvation that you offer each sinner. This assured message is the heart of our church and school! May God keep us focused on his Word, the tangible evidence of his presence with us each day.
